





Presentation by Norma Howell

The video presentation highlights the work of both Bio Detection Dags and Medical Alort Assistance Dags Charify and shows how dags are trained to do life-saving work with the non-impaire detection of the odour of human diseases.

The charity's aim is to help scientists and clinicians to diagnose in a faster and cheaper way that will continue to save tives.

The Medical Alert Assistance Dogs support people with complex health canditions like Type 1 Disberce, Parkinson's Disease, Addison's Disease, POTS, and Allergies when they are in denger of a potentially life-threatening event

Greener Aldborough & Thurgarton

Just a quick update on the group's activities and a reminder of the intention of the group 'to improve the village environment for wildlife and people through walks, talks and activities'.

Importance of dark skies: Our recent speaker on Dark Skies (Katie Dougan) was invited to help us improve our homes' outside lighting to reduce unnecessary light pollution to improve both our own wellbeing and the impact on nocturnal wildlife. Just go outside and have a look – does my lighting trespass and affect my neighbour? The photograph shows 'ideal' outside lighting which focuses the light downwards! Let's do what we can in Aldborough & Thurgarton to improve our impact on the night environment for all.

Pond and Wildlife area – recently we gave the sedge a bit of a 'haircut' to reduce the growth early in the season. We will be cutting the area in August – allowing growth from this period until then and will be scarifying and planting bulbs just around the area of the 'cherry tree' in early September. Swift boxes -With the help of Rob and James Wright we have finally had the swift boxes installed on the outside of the Community Centre and are aware since Caroline Spinks' 'walk and talk' last year in the village, several other boxes have been put up in the vicinity of the Green.

If as a group, we can make small changes that help protect and improve our environment and the wellbeing of our community, we're succeeding. We're always really pleased to welcome volunteers to help with any planned activities.

Aldborough Cricket Club

We are very much still alive!! Just a little different this year!

What a legacy! Did you know that there is evidence of cricket being played on the Green over 300 years ago and it is one of the oldest clubs in the country? We're proud to continue this amazing legacy and encourage the wider community to support us to continue!

Wobbles. Despite our recent successful seasons, our pool of players has dwindled, and we have had to take the difficult decision to remove ourselves from Saturday league cricket for 2025. This was tough but we feel we need to concentrate on re-building excellence.

Competitive cricket continues. Wednesday Cricket is competitive; but it is primarily fun and includes the full age range of players. A brilliant place to start if you are wanting to have a go or return to cricket. This season we have a full programme of Sunday Cricket in a new mini league comprising local sides as well as our usual annual fixtures with the likes of Holkham.

They will join Pete Luke in being responsible for youth development and build on the fantastic work of David and Tina Hooker encouraging youngsters over the past years.

Women's cricket. Starting with a taster session on May 17th, we will be running a series of coaching sessions for women and girls over 13 years. These will focus on softball cricket to improve skills and confidence with an aim to offer informal cricket and competitive cricket for those who want to develop. We would like to thank Nick and Ricki Gadsby for sponsoring this new endeavour.

New officials We have a new President, Tim Knight. Tim has a long and deep association with the Club as player and former Chair. We can think of no better ambassador for the club going forward and we are thrilled to have him on board. We have a newly elected Chair, Rory Stephens, who was previously the club social secretary and Captain for Wednesday and Sunday cricket. And new social secretary, Hayley Winnett. We thank both Jack Hammond for his time and support in the role of President and Michael Biss, former Chair for his two year stint which saw the Saturday side gain back-to-back promotions.




