


Vaccinations this Autumn

Aldborough & Thurgarton Parish Council update


LIGHTING Hopefully, you will notice that we have now replaced all the street lighting (7 in all) to conserve energy and limit the impact of unnecessary lighting for the benefit of wildlife and our own wellbeing. As a Parish Council we are committed to promoting Bio-diversity and we would encourage home-owners to think about the impact of their outside lighting on their neighbours and the nocturnal wildlife. Unfortunately, youngsters have been observed riding an electric scooter over the table tennis table...... we all got up to mischief I'm sure, but can parents please encourage responsible use. 
DOG POO Thank you to those parishioners who are using the dog bins provided around the village (4 in all) these are emptied fortnightly. Unfortunately, there are still owners who don't



clean up after their dogs! Around the Wildflower area by the pond and on the public footpath from Margaret Lily Way through the field behind. To encourage responsible dog ownership, we have recently installed a dog poo-bag dispenser near the public footpath to encourage those irresponsible owners to pick up their dogs' poo. Disappointingly, around the Wildflower area, it does now limit the way we recycle the cut meadowgrass. Dogs' faeces can carry disease. If you are one of these antisocial dog owners perhaps you will bear this in mind next time you don't clean up after your dog.









Please continue to support by leaving donations in our Food Bank collection box **outside the village shop**. The need is very much still there; in 2024 our North Norfolk Foodbank supported a total of 4695 people (of which 1770 were children). Regular help can make a real difference to people in need of extra support.

There is always a list on the box of most wanted items each month, but most things are welcome, with the exception of anything containing alcohol or perishable goods.





Once upon a tune: Aldborough school's inspiring music, art and story event



What do you get if you mix music, story and art?

If you're lucky, you get an inspiring event that introduces young children to whole new experiences. On July 7th awardwinning author and illustrator James Mayhew and former Royal Opera House violinist Caroline Speca brought their 'Once upon a Tune' project to Aldborough Primary School.

James told the story of the Arabian Nights and then Caroline played a piece from Rimsky Korsakov's Scheherazade while James painted a picture to illustrate the tale. Other story, music and art combinations featured the Firebird and The Swan from Carnival of the Animals.

The performances certainly went down well with the children. Lettie, a Year 2 pupil, said, "The music made me want to learn to play the violin," while her friend William said, "It made me feel really good. If I was James Mayhew I would want to write thousands of books!"

James commented on the way even the younger children at Aldborough were so engaged in the performance. "I know when I come into a school and see such wonderful displays on the wall, it's going to be a great day," he said. "You have something very special in this school, you should be very proud of it."

Teacher Nicola Cuthill who arranged the performances said, "Learning about one of our most important school values, resilience, from two amazing professional artists helped the children understand that hard work and not giving up really do pay off. To have two exemplary role models to demonstrate this in such a creative way was just amazing, not only for the children but the adults as well."



However, we always **welcome extra hands backstage**, where the crew is just as important as the actors and the work can be just as exciting.


Are you interested in something to occupy some of your time over the winter? Could you spare us a few hours? We are a very friendly group and always give newcomers a big welcome.
