





Aldborough Primary School

2025 has got off to a flying start and we have exciting projects in the pipeline

Premise improvements: We will quite literally be raising the roof (not quite as exciting as it sounds) over the next couple of months. Beginning in mid-February and finishing end of April we will be replacing two ceilings to improve insulation. There will be scaffolding and skips adding to the excitement of the school day. As another energy saving measure our lighting system was changed to LED over the Christmas holidays. We have all the benefits of our light, bright classrooms at a fraction of the cost!

Visits and Events: Two exciting visits already- Olly Day brought his travelling magic road safety show to school where he treated our children to a morning of magic tricks and entertainment while learning many important rules for road safety. This will be reinforced for our Year 5 children later this year when they complete their Bikeability course. We've also been visited by Rosie from the Norwich Science Festival who taught some of the children in KS2 how to become food scientists. Her combination of puppets and gigantic flowers were engaging and entertaining and fitted perfectly with our science curriculum and forest school.

Later this term there will be trips to Norwich Cathedral to learn about world religions, Norwich Castle to find out about farming through history, Wroxham Barns to meet the animals and the Henry Blogg Museum are coming to school – despite the museum being closed for a year! Add a dodgeball tournament, a drumming assembly with a world renowned drummer, a touring opera performance and maths workshops for parents and it is shaping up to be a good year!

Greener Aldborough & Thurgarton

Aldborough & Thurgarton Parish Council have now completed the changeover of the old-style lanterns to LED part-night PEC which have timers to reduce unnecessary lighting. These 7 lanterns are principally around the Green. This should not only be good for wildlife and wellbeing but will also mean less maintenance and power used.

Kate Dougan (Campaign to Protect Rural England volunteer) who gave a talk in February 2022 (Dark Skies) is returning to help us continue to reduce unnecessary lighting in the village and remind us of the benefits of dark skies to ourselves and wildlife.

From May onwards a new resident, Chris will lead moth trapping sessions. Chris posts wonderful wildlife photos on our Facebook page. Do bring your youngsters to the 'moth-trapping' sessions so that we can get a new generation invested in making sure we create the environment and have the knowledge to protect these little creatures. 
